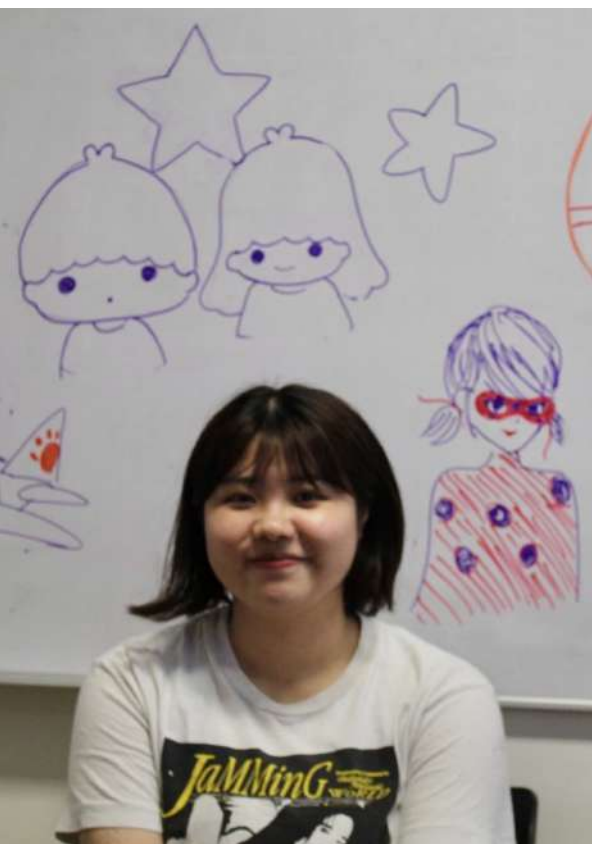
Meet the teachers at ELC Malaysia

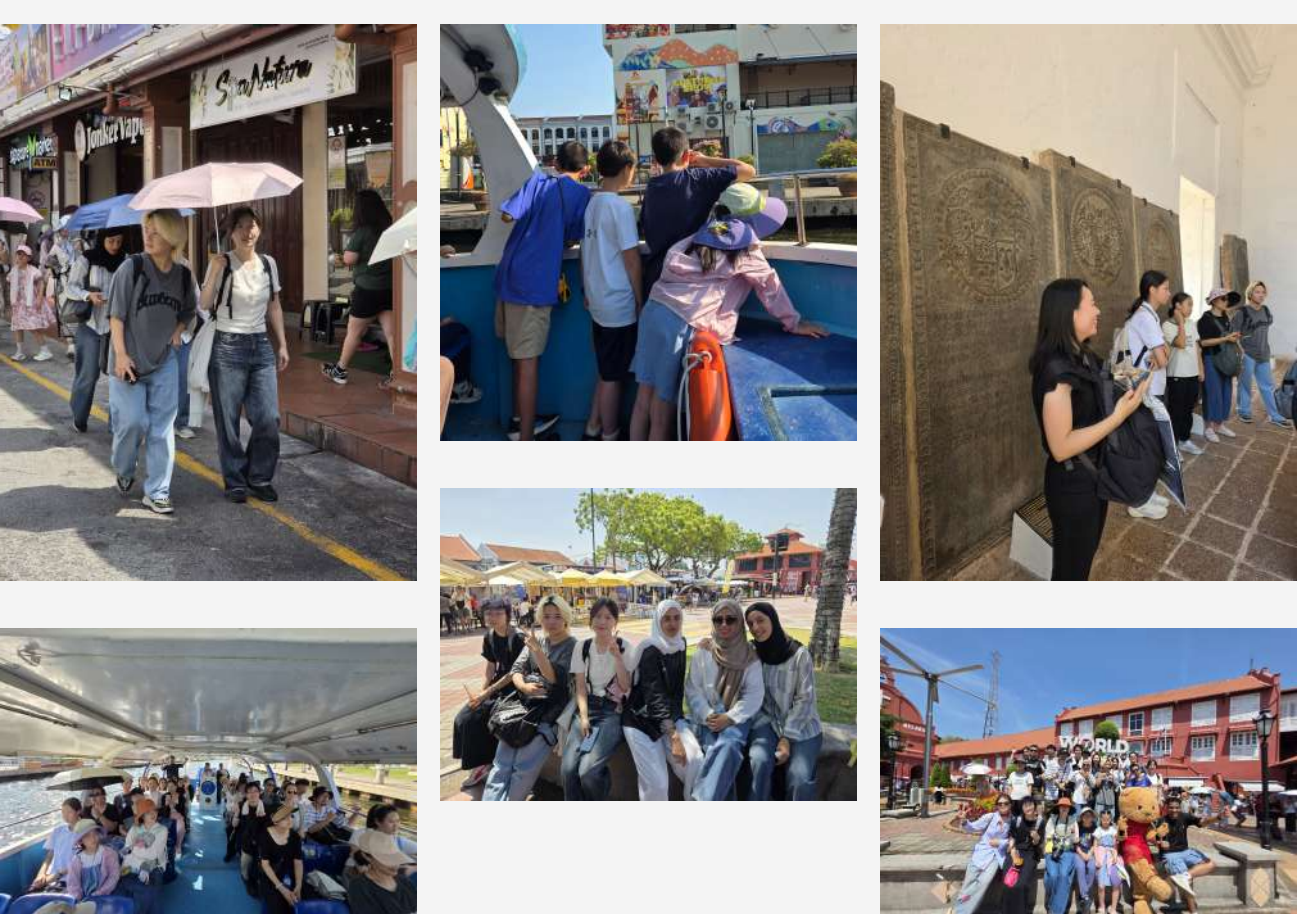
